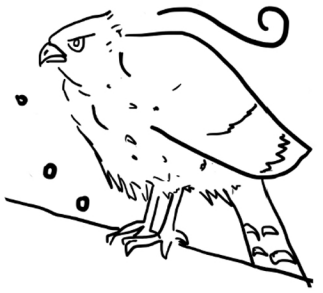

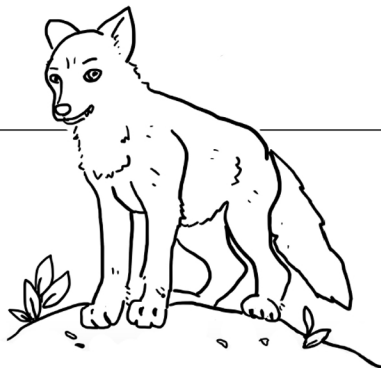

Arctic	The science of weather and weather patterns



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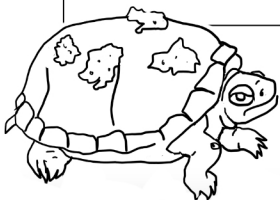

Category Five	A (slightly smaller) body of water bordering Mexico, Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Florida, and Cuba

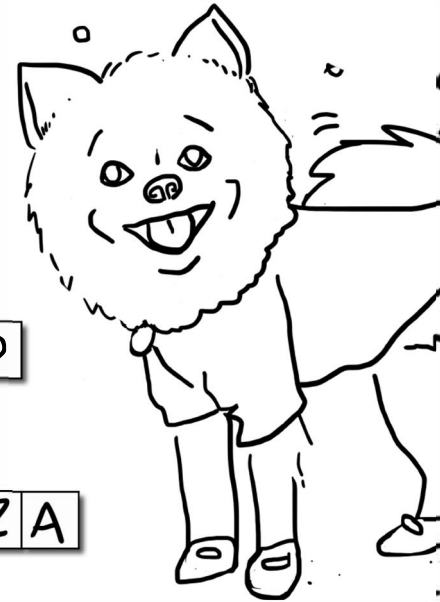
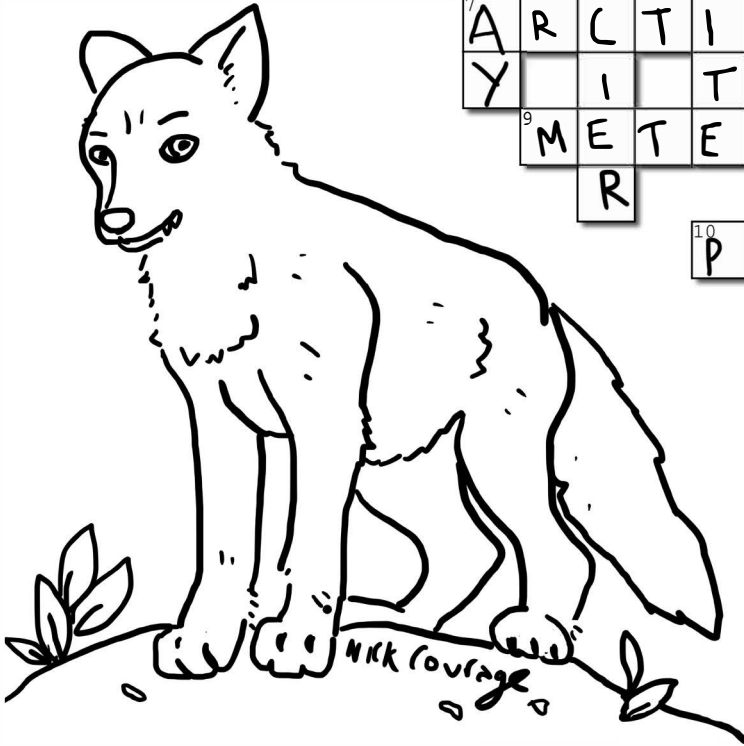
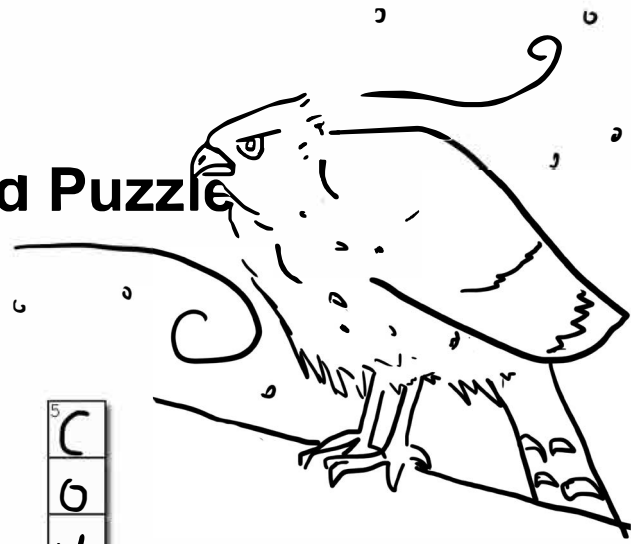
