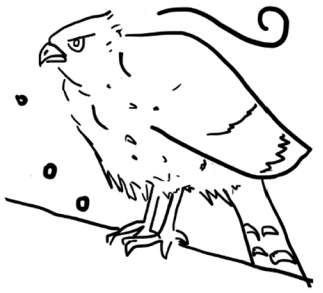


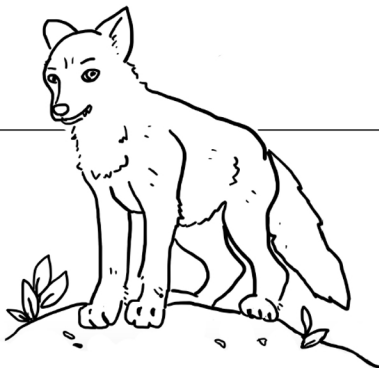

<b>Climate</b>	Partially melted snow
<b>Meteorologist</b>	An underground railroad (New York is famous for these!)
<b>Blizzard</b>	Someone who studies the weather
<b>Parka</b>	A power failure that makes the lights go out
<b>Meteorology</b>	A <i>huge</i> mass of ice that moves very slowly over land
<b>Subway</b>	The region around the North Pole (can also be used to mean "very cold")
<b>Blackout</b>	Weather conditions over a long period of time
<b>Whiteout</b>	A severe snowstorm with very high winds
<b>Glacier</b>	A windproof jacket (usually with a hood)
<b>Slush</b>	A blizzard so thick that visibility is nearly zero
<b>Arctic</b>	The science of weather and weather patterns



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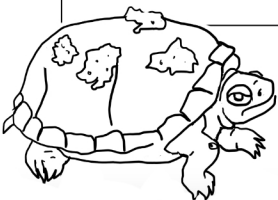

<b>Climate</b>	The study of climates
<b>Meteorologist</b>	A large body of water bordering the east coast of the United States
<b>Hurricane</b>	To move from a dangerous place to a safe one
<b>Gale-Force Winds</b>	The strongest possible hurricane
<b>Climatology</b>	A densely populated colony or nesting area, especially for birds
<b>Eye of the Storm</b>	Weather conditions over a long period of time
<b>The Gulf of Mexico</b>	The calm center of a hurricane
<b>Atlantic Ocean</b>	An extremely powerful storm
<b>Evacuate</b>	Someone who studies the weather
<b>Rookery</b>	A strong wind (blowing at over 40 to 50 miles per hour)
<b>Category Five</b>	A (slightly smaller) body of water bordering Mexico, Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Florida, and Cuba



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
